

## Vermont Marketer Adds 30,000-Gal. Storage

**J**ust in time for winter, Gillespie Fuels Inc. of Randolph and Northfield, Vt. last fall completed the installation of a new 30,000-gal. storage tank at its tank farm location in Randolph.

To mark the occasion, on Oct. 17 Vermont Gov. James Douglas joined several members of Gillespie Fuels' staff and other guests for a ribbon-cutting ceremony. "We are pleased to open this facility in Randolph," said Gillespie Fuels president Karen Gillespie Korrow. "The completion of this facility will allow Gillespie Fuels to better serve its customers in Randolph and surrounding communities."

Gillespie Fuels Inc., founded in 1962, markets propane, fuel oil, kerosene, and low-sulfur diesel to customers within a 50-mile radius of Northfield. The company employs a full-time staff of 25, and features a complete burner service sales department that offers heating installations, water heaters, and appliances, along with 24-hour emergency service provided by state-certified oil and propane technicians.
